#### In detail


The University of Navarra is a **Catholic University founded in 1952** on strong core values. Today has over **13.000 students**, **16 faculties** and **9 research centers**. The University has several campuses in **Pamplona**, **San Sebastián**, **Madrid**, **Barcelona**, **Munich** and **New York**.

**Tecnun**, The Faculty of Engineering and the **Research Center CEIT** are located on the same campus in San Sebastián. CEIT with over 250 researchers in different areas which are closely associated with the different degrees offered in Tecnun.

#### **Travel to San Sebastian**

#### Flights should be into either Bilbao (BIO) or San Sebastian (EAS)

Bilbao is the larger airport and will have more flight options. Bilbao is slightly further (1 hour) from San Sebastian but transport options are more frequent/easier.

#### You can purchase a bus ticket from BIO to San Sebastian here.

If you flight to SS, you can catch bus **E20 or E21 at San Sebastian airport** bus stop and they will take you to the city center.



#### Housing

San Sebastian has several residences that accommodate Tecnun students. We also offer apartment options for long term students.

#### Transportation

#### The public transport system is safe and convenient.

San Sebastian is a very walkable city. You can walk everywhere.

**Taxis** are available but must be hailed at designated taxi stands. You can book a taxi <u>here</u>.

Also, the city has a system of **mechanical and electric bicycle rentals.** There are two types of pass: a regular 12-month pass or an occasional pass for a minimum of 30 days. You can register <u>here</u>.

There is a **transport card** which allows travel with the same card on all public transport. The **MUGI system** offers great advantages to those who frequently use public transport in Gipuzkoa. The system is based on a single payment support and on the distribution of zones, so that when traveling in the same zone on different means of transport, the same fare is paid. The system offers free transfers, discounts and bonuses.




#### Email

#### As an exchange student you will receive your university email account (user@alumni.unav.es) when you enroll.

You can access your University email through **Google Gmail** if you enter the University credentials in the gmail page **user@alumni.unav.es + password** (the same you use for MiUnav).

From this email account you will also have access to Google Apps: Calendar, Drive, Hangouts, among others.



## Wi-fi eduroam

The University is part of the Eduroam wifi network, along with many universities throughout the world. You can access the network from any place on the campus.







At the beginning of the academic year, every student is given a university card once they have enrolled.

It allows you to:

- -Access the library and take out books
- -Access all **buildings** on campus
- -Access sports facilities
- -As a form of identity during exams

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
It is important that you understand from the start how to manage your academic life.



## If you are an undergraduate or an exchange student...

#### All students are assigned a MENTOR that provides them with personalized tutoring throughout their studies.

You should find out who your mentor is in the first few days. It is advisable that you **meet with your mentor regularly** from the beginning of the academic year so that you can start your studies in the best way.







#### miUNAV

#### You are already familiar with miUNAV, the online portal through which you enroll in the university.

miUNAV also enables access to the **Academic Information Portal** and processes all academic queries: submit a request, check your grades, apply for a certificate, etc.

#### **ADI Online Classroom**

Aula Virtual ADI or ADI Online Classroom is a digital portal for university teaching. This system gives you direct access to:

- The **webpage** of every subject with information about the program, evaluation criteria, bibliography, etc.
- Notifications and updates from professors
- **Organization and relevant information** for the academic year: election of student representatives, calendars, etc





#### Universidad de Navarra App

Use the Universidad de Navarra app to check your exam results whenever you want, from wherever you are.

Using your **smartphone** you can check your results, see the date, time and place of revision, and find out whether the grade is provisional or definitive. Furthermore, you can receive a **notification** every time a new result is published.

To access the app, all you need is your **username + password** of your email **@alumni.unav.es** and select your academic transcript.

## Academic Regulations


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Like all organizations and as a third level institution according to national law, the University has a series of regulations to be followed so as to ensure it continues to be a center of academic excellence.

There are many types of regulations covering different areas: evaluation procedures, behavior, personalized mentoring, requisites to fulfill to pass from one academic year to the next, etc.





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#### Academic calendar

The academic year usually begins on **the first day of September and finishes in the final week of June**, with holidays at Christmas and Easter.





### **Campus safety**

The campus and the city are very safe, but it is always useful to have the relevan information about **steps to follow in case of emergency**.

In case of accident or emergency you should **call 112**, which is the national emergency number. Please save it in your telephone contacts list.

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
University life is more than classes, presentations, or the laboratory.

### International Students

International students need information and support in certain processes and procedures to ensure their integration in Spain and on campus is as quick and easy as possible.



#### Immigration

International students need to complete several processes so that their stay in Spain is legal.

Whether you are a citizen of a EU country, or a national of a non-EU country, you will find **all the relevant information** <u>here</u>.



#### Healthcare and medical insurance

To receive healthcare in Spain, international students need medical insurance which has a good coverage, valid for a whole academic year, to be renewed annually.

Students from the EU can use their **European Health Insurance Card** for healthcare, but private insurance will include more coverage (like repatriation) which is advisable.


If you need to go to the hospital for any reason, we recommend that you go to the **Policlinica Gipuzkoa** as they are used to receiving international students with foreign medical insurance coverage.

You can check insurance options in the <u>web</u>, and how to get a medical appointment or go to hospital <u>here</u>.

#### Banks

Have some local currency on hand upon arrival (can order from bank beforehand or use ATM at arrival airport). Contact your bank and credit cards prior to travel.

To open a bank account your will need to have a **TIE (Foreign Identity Card)**, which takes some time to obtain.




#### **Cell Phones**

There are several cell phone companies in Spain offering competitive deals.

If you will be studying for several years at the University, it is better to **sign a contract**; however, you will need the **TIE** (Foreign Identity Card) to do so.

For short stays you have three options:

- 1. Get an international calling plan and keep your US number
- 2. Have an "unlocked" phone and then get **a SIM card** and pay as you go
- 3. Just use WIFI Messaging apps



#### Homologation of high school degree and UNEDasiss Accreditation

All students coming from non-Spanish education systems must officialize their high school degrees.

Two possible ways depending on the education system of origin:

**European Union education systems or IB Program** 

Apply for UNEDasiss credential

**Non-European Union education systems** 

Apply for **homologation** of high school degree



#### **International coordinator**

The key contact for exchange students or short-term students is the International Coordinator in your School.

Contact your **Coordinator** for any queries about subjects, timetables or any academic issues that arise. You can find their contact details <u>here</u>.

#### **International Relations Office**

All international students can contact this service for any nonacademic questions or queries that may arise. The office for **exchange students** is located in the **secretariat**, first floor of the Ibaeta building. The office for **short-term students** is on the second floor of the same building. #### Buddy program

#### The University also offers a <u>Buddy Program</u>, which is run by students of the International Committee

The Buddy Program was created to **help international exchange students** with any questions they may have prior to their arrival in San Sebatian and to ease their transition to a new city, university, and stage of life.

Each international exchange student is assigned a buddy who is also a student, either Spanish or international, who has been in a similar situation and will be able to help the student with basic questions from advising on accommodation and classes to referring questions to the appropriate university staff. Most importantly, **this program aims to help the international student integrate into the university community.**

The University of Navarra is committed to advancing the mental health and wellbeing of its students If you or someone you know is feeling overwhelmed, depressed, and/or in need of support.


